1. Executive Summary:

Since its inception in March 2014, the Chair has inspired its action towards the fulfilment of its objectives (Article 2 of the Chair agreement) in close collaboration with UNESCO:

- To provide training on global health at the undergraduate and postgraduate levels.
 - The undergraduate elective <u>Course on Tropical Medicine and Global Health</u>, addressed to students in Medicine, has been run from 2104 to 2017 and it is planned to take place in 2018. On average, 20 students have attended the course every year;
 - The <u>Core Course of the TropEdEurope European Master of International Health</u> has been run from 2014 to 2017 and it is planned to take place in 2018. On average, 15 students have attended the course every year. In addition, since 2014, the Universities of Florence and Brescia have jointly yearly organized the Italian Master in Tropical Medicine and Global Health, of which the Core Course is a module. On average, 5 students have attended the Italian Master Course every year;
 - The <u>European Course in Migration Health</u>, organized by the Chair in collaboration with ESCMID, is scheduled to take place from 1 to 4 October 2017 in Palermo.
- To develop and expand collaborations in the field of global health with higher education institutions from resource-limited countries.

Memorandums of Understanding (MoUs) aimed at strengthening mutual relationships and students/teachers' exchange have been signed with:

- Ethiopian Catholic University St Thomas Aquinas (ECUSTA), Addis Ababa, Ethiopia
- Universidade Pedagogica, Maputo, Mozambique

 To promote operational research on poverty-related and neglected infectious diseases in highly endemic countries and in Europe, and disseminate results widely

Over 70 articles have been published on international peer-reviewed high impact journals in the period 2014-september 2017, reporting the results of the researches carried out by the Chairholder and his team on poverty-related and neglected infectious diseases. In addition, 12 chapters of book have been written and 42 dissertations have been supervised;

- To foster networking, capacity development and the sharing of knowledge and of good practices in the field of focus, notably through the organization of meetings and workshops;

 - The IV National Congress of the Italian University Network on Cooperation for

Mr Maciej Nalecz, Director of the Division of Science Policy and Capacity-Building UNESCO – Headquarters and Mr Casimiro Vizzini, from the same Division, actively participated to the meeting, as well as a significant number of Italian UNESCO Chairholders
