E-portfolio (if applicable)

Nominated students are expected to prepare an e-portfolio of 12-15 digital images to support their application. Once the student has submitted their online application to us, they will be sent specific instructions on how and where to upload their e-portfolio images. The quality of the portfolio can be the deciding factor in whether a student is accepted or not.

Credit equivalency
