Advanced Skill Course – International Summer School

“Deindustrialisation as a project – The project within deindustrialisation”

Call for applications for the **selection of no. 9 professor or researcher enrolled at University of Latin America with an active MoU** with University of Brescia to attend the Advanced Skill Course – International Summer School “*Deindustrialisation as a project – The project within deindustrialisation*” (ASC); organized by the University of Brescia, Department of Civil Engineering, Architecture, Land, Environment and Mathematics (DICATAM).

Art.1 - Training activities

The Advanced Skill Course - International Summer School “*Deindustrialisation as a project – The project within deindustrialisation*” (ASC) will be held at the University of Brescia, from 8 September to 13 September 2025 (6 working days). This ASC is conceived as an essentially experimental moment, where to think about the categories of space, city, territory and landscape through fluid and reciprocal processes of intellectual exchange. The aim is to update the tools of the project in the face of the challenges and contemporary discourse on the energy transition, sustainability, the relationship between project and nature (and thus urban-rural, city-mountain, plain-altitude, dense areas-sparse areas, and other dichotomous readings of space developed over decades of Western territorial sciences). The goal of the ASC is, therefore, necessarily to open the disciplines of design to different and interdisciplinary approaches (economics, ecology, political geography; philosophy; sociology), providing participants with qualitative tools through which to construct an in-depth reading of territory, without renouncing the concrete and operational specificities that describe and produce this, and other, territories of deindustrialisation. In this sense, the aim of the ASC is to support the necessity of critical thinking to address the challenges posed by the historical-political process to architectural, urban, and territorial design.

The ASC will focus on the following topics:

- Deindustrialization processes
- Environment, exploitation and pollutions
- Landscape
- Urban regeneration
- Social inclusion

Art.2 - Rules of participation

Attendance in person is required.

Art.3 – Eligibility participation criteria

The call is addressed to University of Latin America with University of Brescia that have an active Memorandum of Understanding with the University of Brescia.

As a priority, the distribution of the 9 professors or researchers who will be admitted to participate in the ASC if they are enrolled in the following disciplines: Architecture, Civil or Environmental Engineering, Social Sciences, History.

Art. 4 - Applications and deadlines

Participation in the Summer School is restricted to a maximum number of 9 Professor or Researcher. Applications take place via google form up to 4 June 2025 by June 14, 2025

- Information on the research areas.

The selection will be based on the overall assessment of the submitted documents and is entrusted to the ASC Committee. The results of the selection will be published on the University of Brescia project websites and communicated by e-mail.

Art.5 - Selection and participation grant

The selection of the winners will be based on merit criteria at the sole discretion of the Scientific Committee of the ASC. The University of Brescia contributes to covering expenses for the participation in the ASC by the project TNE Latin America HerIT4Future.
