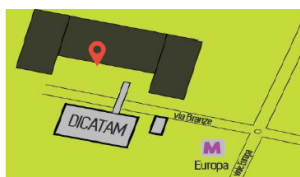

Abstract (max 300 words)	<p>This advanced training course focuses on the internationalization of higher education systems in Italy and Africa as a strategic driver for sustainable development. It brings together academic professional, and stakeholders to examine and strengthen collaborative practices between the two regions.</p>



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	<p>The course provides a comprehensive overview of current challenges faced by higher education institutions, such as brain drain, unequal access, demographic shifts, and limited mobility. It highlights how transnational education (TNE) and joint academic initiatives can contribute to improve the quality, accessibility, and global relevance of higher education.</p> <p>The course is structured into 4 thematic modules covering environment/energy, architecture and inclusive building, health and agriculture. These modules aim to connect academic knowledge with territorial needs and foster collaboration between universities and external stakeholders, including public institutions, private companies, and civil society.</p> <p>Through interactive workshops, group work, and presentations of successful case studies, participants will gain practical tools for designing joint educational offers and research projects. The program also promotes mutual understanding of the structural and cultural characteristics of African and Italian academic systems, laying the foundation for long-term institutional partnerships.</p> <p>Ultimately, the course supports the development of a shared vision for international education that is equitable, resilient, and responsive to global challenges. It empowers participants to become active contributors in building inclusive, high-quality higher education systems aligned with sustainable development priorities in both African and Italian/EU contexts.</p> <p>Follow-up activities will be pursued (e.g., online community, publication of proceedings, seed grants for pilot projects).</p>
