<b>Short description:</b>	This Blended Intensive Programme (BIP) will explore the major security and political challenges facing the European Union in era characterized by a series of profound and interconnected crises and a rapid transformation of the liberal international order. Against the erosion of the international rules-based order, the rise of geoeconomic and geopolitical tensions, as well as increasing populism and polarization, it asks students to think about how the

European Union can protect democracy and fostering internal and external security. Through a series of lectures and seminars, this intensive course will examine the core issues facing the European Union both at the domestic and international level, bringing perspectives from International Relations and Political Science.
