



CALL FOR APPLICATIONS FOR ACCESS TO RIGHT TO STUDY SERVICES (Scholarships, Accommodation and Catering Services) - A.Y. 2026/2027

The following English translation is provided as a mere courtesy. For all legal effects and purposes, please refer to the official Italian version

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Premises

Non-deferrable deadlines for the presentation of online applications for all students:

- **Scholarships (Section 1):** 24th September 2026 at 1:00 pm (CEST)

PLEASE NOTE: applicants must have an ISEE certificate valid for subsidised services for the Right to University Education (or Equivalent ISEE) by the non-extendable deadline of 24th September 2026.

With regard to the **Catering Service**, no specific application is required; access to the service will be granted automatically to students according to the outcome of the ranking list.

- **Accommodation Service (Section 2):**
 - Returning students: 20th August 2026 at 1:00 pm (CEST)
 - Freshmen (first year of Bachelor's and Master's programmes) and Non-first-year students: 20th August 2026 at 1:00 pm (CEST)

PLEASE NOTE: applicants must have an ISEE certificate valid for subsidised services for the Right to University Education (or Equivalent ISEE) by the non-extendable deadline of 20th August 2026 so that the economic status requirement can also be evaluated for ranking purposes.

In the absence of such documentation, only the merit requirement will be considered.

Applications may also be submitted before formal enrolment or registration for the academic year 2026/2027, as well as prior to taking any admission tests for the courses.

Applications that do not meet the requirements stated in this Call, that are incomplete, submitted after the set deadlines, and/or using methods other than those indicated in the Call, will not be accepted.

WARNING – Filter semester:

Students enrolling in the filter semester must apply for the scholarship following the standard procedures, methods, and deadlines – i.e., those applicable also to students not enrolled in the filter semester – for all DSU benefits they wish to access in the academic year 2026/2027.

Please note that, following the publication of the national ranking list for Medicine, Dentistry, and Veterinary Medicine as per Article 10 of Ministerial Decree No. 941/2026, the deadlines will be reopened through an additional application window for the awarding of DSU benefits related to the scholarship, accommodation, and catering services for students who participated in the filter semester in other regions or universities within the same region and, based on the results of the competition, enrol in a different study programme.

Only these students will be allowed to submit their online applications from 19th January 2027 until 5th March 2027, unless extended.

These students must possess an ISEE certificate valid for subsidised services for the Right to University Education (or Equivalent ISEE) referring to the calendar year 2026, as required for students included in the first ranking list.

The provisions of this Call may be subject to modifications in light of any subsequent national decrees or regional ordinances.

Art. 1 General Provisions

For the 2026/2027 academic year, the University of Brescia has issued this Call for access to the Right to Study services, in accordance with the provisions established by the Prime Ministerial Decree dated 9 April 2001, Lombardy Regional Law no. 33 of 13 December 2004, Legislative Decree no. 68 of 29 March 2012, Ministerial Decree no. 1320 of 17 December 2021, as well as Regional Council Resolution no. XII/6298 from the session held on 15 June 2026.

This Call is financed by contributions allocated by the Ministry of University and Research (MUR), the Lombardy Region, and funds made available by the University.

The services governed by this Call are available to students who are enrolled or intend to enrol in the courses offered by the University of Brescia in the 2026/2027 academic year, and who meet the merit, economic status, and academic regularity requirements specified in the individual sections for each service.

For all matters not expressly covered in the sections on accommodation and catering services, please refer to the section on scholarships.

Definitions:

The following definitions apply for the purposes of the allocation of Right to Study services:

- **Eligible:** student who meets the required merit and economic status conditions to participate in the Call.
- **Beneficiary:** student who meets the merit and economic status requirements and is awarded the scholarship.
- **Eligible non-beneficiary:** student who meets the merit and economic status requirements but is not awarded the scholarship due to lack of available funds.
- **Partial beneficiary:** student who receives 50% of the benefit due to one of the following conditions:
 - enrolled in the 1st year beyond the normal duration of the course (i.e., as a “fuori corso” student);
 - enrolled part-time;
 - enrolled in the 1st year and meets the merit requirement ex post by 30th November 2027.
- **First university registration:** first academic year of enrolment in any university-level course following completion of secondary school, even if the course is different from the one attended in the 2026/2027 academic year, and regardless of the outcome of that academic career (e.g. withdrawal, transfer, graduation, etc.), in any Italian or foreign university, at the same study level/cycle.

- **Disabled student:** student with certified disability pursuant to Article 3, subsections 1 and 3, of Law no. 104 dated 5 February 1992, or with a disability equal to or greater than 66%.
- **ISEE (2026):** ISEE valid for subsidised services for the Right to Academic Study, issued in accordance with Article 8 of DPCM 159/2013, in the name of the student applying for the services set out in the Call.
- **ISPE:** Equivalent Asset Situation Indicator, calculated by dividing the Asset Situation Indicator (ISP) by the equivalence scale (SE) indicated in the ISEE.
- **Equivalent ISEE (2026/2027 a.y.):** for students not residing in Italy and/or with income and assets located in countries other than Italy, it is necessary to contact one of the CAAF (Authorised Tax Assistance Centres) partnered with the University of Brescia.
- **Revocation:** annulment/exclusion from the benefit, with the resulting obligation for the student to return any funds and/or services received. Accommodation and catering services already used will be adjusted as specified in the relevant sections.

Students are required to promptly notify the University of Brescia by opening a ticket through the [INFOSTUDENTE](#) service of any events related to the scholarship or other services occurring after submission and confirmation of the online application (such as obtaining a different scholarship or financial aid, transfer to another university, change in course location, graduation, inability to continue studies, withdrawal, etc.).

If, during periodic checks, it is found that such communication has not been made as required, the student will lose entitlement to benefits and subsidised services and may be subject to related consequences (e.g. revocation and reimbursement of the scholarship received, loss of tuition fee exemption, recalculation of the costs of services used, etc.), without prejudice to any further penalties provided by law.

SECTION 1: SCHOLARSHIPS

Art. 2 Number of scholarships

The number of scholarships to assign will be defined based on the overall budget availability.

Art. 3 General participation conditions

Italian students, students from countries in the European Union, foreign students as per Presidential Decree no. 394 of 31 August 1999 implementing Legislative Decree no. 286 of 25 July 1998, and stateless or political refugee students enrolled or intending to enrol at the University of Brescia can take part in the Call.

Applications must be submitted via the university website at <http://www.unibs.it> > **OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES** > **RIGHT TO STUDY** > **SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS** > **DSU CALLS** > Call for Applications for Access to Right to Study Services – 2026/2027 a.y. > Online Services Application – Scholarship, by following the instructions provided and confirming the application by the deadline stated in this Call.

Confirmation of the online application must be made **no later than 24 September 2026 at 1:00 pm (CEST)**.

PLEASE NOTE: Applicants must possess a valid ISEE certificate for subsidised services for the Right to Study (or Equivalent ISEE) issued by **24 September 2026**.

Warning: Obtaining the ISEE or Equivalent ISEE certificate from a CAAF (Authorised Tax Assistance Centre) may take several weeks; therefore, students are strongly advised to request the certification well in advance. Alternatively, the certificate may be requested through the INPS website using SPID (Public Digital Identity System).

Applications may be submitted even before the formal registration or enrolment in the 2026/2027 academic year, as well as prior to taking any admission tests.

Applications that do not comply with the requirements indicated in this Call, are incomplete, submitted after the deadline, and/or presented in a manner different from that specified above, will not be accepted.

To benefit from the Right to Study services, students must be enrolled for the 2026/2027 academic year:

1. For the first time in a regular year of a Bachelor's degree programme, Master's degree programme, or Single Cycle Master's degree programme, up to one additional year beyond the standard duration of the study programme, starting from the first university registration (see definition). If the beneficiary is a disabled student, enrolment is permitted up to two additional years beyond the normal duration of the course, starting from the first university registration.

PLEASE NOTE: For the 2026/2027 academic year, subject to budget availability, scholarships financed by university funds may also be awarded to students who were previously enrolled in a degree programme (even if different from the one attended in the 2026/2027 a.y.) of the same level/study cycle, in any Italian or foreign university, whose academic career was closed due to withdrawal, transfer, or change of programme. In this case, in addition to the economic requirement, the merit requirement must be met by considering the number of academic years since the first university registration and the Italian

university credits (CFU) obtained in the previous academic career, regardless of whether those credits are recognised for the new programme. (See Art. 7 for detailed requirements). For example: if in the 2025/2026 a.y. I was enrolled for the first time in a Bachelor's degree programme and, after withdrawing or transferring, I enrol again in 2026/2027 in the 1st year of another programme, I must meet the merit requirements applicable to students enrolling in the 2nd year of that programme (e.g. 35 CFU for open-access programmes – see Art. 7 for details).

2. In a specialisation course (excluding those in the medical field as per Legislative Decree no. 368/1999);
3. In a PhD course (excluding those who are recipients of a scholarship as per Ministerial Decree no. 224/1999 or of a research fellowship pursuant to Law no. 449 of 27 December 1997), established by Ministerial Decree no. 210, Art. 4, of 3 July 1998, for a period of time equal to that specified by the relevant academic regulations.

Art. 4 Incompatibility

Scholarships cannot be combined with similar forms of financial aid provided by the managing body or by other public or private institutions. In such cases, students may choose between one form of support or the other.

Exceptions include:

- scholarships awarded by national or international institutions aimed at supporting training or research activities through study or research periods abroad;
- scholarships granted to students enrolled in Bachelor's, Master's, or Single Cycle degree programmes who participate in national mobility programmes;
- merit-based awards granted by university institutions to students enrolled in excellence programmes.

Art. 5 Other reasons for exclusion

Students are in any case excluded from the benefits in the 2026/2027 academic year in the following cases:

- if they already hold a qualification of the same level or higher than the course for which the scholarship has been applied for in the 2026/2027 academic year;
- if they have outstanding debts with the University of Brescia at the time of the publication of the scholarship ranking and/or at the time of the awarding of beneficiary status, unless instalment agreements have been signed.

Art. 6 Transfers

Students who transfer from another university after the beginning of the academic year must request that the university or managing body for the Right to Study at their previous institution transmit their application, provided it was submitted within the deadlines set out in that institution's Call for Applications.

The regularisation of the transfer application must be completed by 4 November 2026.

Admission to the ranking will be subject to meeting both the merit and economic status requirements. In the event of a transfer to another university after the beginning of the academic year, the application submitted to the University of Brescia will be forwarded to the university or managing body of the institution to which the student has requested the transfer, only upon timely and explicit written request by the student, to the certified email address ammcentr@cert.unibs.it (also valid if sent from a non-certified email account).

In such cases, the student will forfeit the benefit granted by the University of Brescia and must return any instalments received as well as repay the cost difference for any subsidised services used.

Art. 7 Requirements for inclusion in the scholarship rankings

Students must necessarily have both the merit and economic status requirements, as specified below.

A) MERIT REQUIREMENTS

Students enrolled in the first year of all courses

Students enrolled in the first year for the first time need to comply the following requirements::

- access requirement
- intermediate requirement (for beneficiary students only)
- final requirement to be able to confirm the benefit if necessary.

Access requirement:

1) First Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses:

- High School Diploma mark of not less than 70/100.

Students who have graduated from high school in a country other than Italy will be assessed in accordance with the value shown on the application of the conversion formula adopted by MIUR (MIUR note dated 4 June 2007 - see Appendix 1).

For disabled students only the regular registration is requested

2) Second Cycle degree courses:

- Enrolment in the 2026/2027 academic year

Intermediate requirement (in order to obtain an advance payment):

Students enrolled for the first time in the first year of any First and Second Cycle Degree or Single Cycle Degree who will have acquired at least 15 CFUs by 31 March 2027 will receive an intermediate payment in the amount of 15%.

Final requirement:

Students enrolled for the first time in the first year of all First Cycle degree, Second Cycle degree and Single Cycle degree courses are attributed the status of beneficiary in the ranking based on both the access requirements and the economic requirements as per Point B.

To confirm 100% of the status of beneficiary or eligible non-beneficiary, students must attain a minimum number of valid credits by 10 August 2027.

To confirm 50% of the status of partial beneficiary or eligible non-beneficiary, students must attain a minimum number of credits by 30 November 2027.

Please note that the CFUs to attain are:

- 35 for First Cycle, Second Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses whose annual number of attainable credits is equal to or greater than 60;
- For all First Cycle, Second Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses whose annual number of attainable credits is less than 60, a proportional criterion* to the above-mentioned merit requirement is applied, rounded down, based on the number of credits provided for in the educational regulations of each course.

PLEASE NOTE - Medical area internships: CFUs acquired through the final internship exams, held—according to the academic organisation of the Health Professions Degree Courses—after 10 August 2026, are valid provided that the outcome of those exams is registered by 31 October 2027. Students who do not attain the minimum number of credits indicated above by 30 November 2027 will have their scholarship revoked (see Art. 12).

Attention: The final requirement does not apply to disabled students.

Students enrolled in years following the first year of all courses

Students enrolled in years following the first one of a First Cycle, Second Cycle and Single Cycle degree course must have attained the minimum number of educational credits specified in the following Table (for courses whose annual attainable credits are equal to or greater than 60), arising from exams taken and officially recorded by 10 August 2026:

For students enrolling in the 2026/2027 A.Y. from the first absolute registration:

WARNING: The number of educational credits needed to access the scholarship ranking is calculated with reference to the credits expected in each previous academic year, starting from the year of first enrolment or re-enrolment, also considering the academic years in which the student repeated, for any reason, the same year of registration at the same level of studies.

PLEASE NOTE: Medical area internships: CFUs acquired through final internship exams, held—based on the university teaching organisation of the Health Professions Degree Courses—after 10 August 2026, are valid provided that the outcome of those exams is registered by 31 October 2026.

To determine the merit requirement, a proportional criterion*, rounded down, is applied to the above-mentioned merit requirement for all First Cycle, Second Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses whose

annual number of attainable credits is less than 60, referring to the number of credits specified in the educational regulations of each course.

Part-time students both in the first and subsequent years

The merit requirements requested and the value of the bonus for part-time students will be equal to the half of the values indicated in this Call.

*** Proportional criterion**

Please note that for all degree courses whose annual number of attainable credits is less than 60, the **PROPORTIONAL CRITERION is applied**, rounded down, to determine the merit requirement, referring to the number of credits specified in the educational regulations of each course.

The credits set out in the Study Plan can be checked on the dedicated website of each degree course.

For example:

If the total number of CFUs set out in the Study Plan for a student enrolled in the 2nd year is 52, the calculation must be made as follows:

$52/60 \times 35 = 30.3333$ which, **ROUNDED DOWN**, results in 30.

For degree courses that include annual courses, the merit requirements are reduced by 2 credits for each annual course activated in the relevant academic year.

Validity of credits (for all students)

CFUs valid for scholarship purposes are those acquired from exams taken or already fully validated and recorded, specifically indicated in the Study Plan proposed by the degree course or by the student and already approved, for the 2026/2027 academic year, by the Programme Board at the date the application is submitted.

PLEASE NOTE: Midterm tests and individual modules are not included in the calculation.

Transfers from another university/degree course and **International Mobility students:** Exams still to be completed, i.e. only partially validated by the Programme Board of the University of Brescia, are excluded from the count of CFUs valid for scholarship purposes.

Ph.D. and specialisation courses:

A student enrolled in a **Ph.D. or specialisation course** must:

Ph.D. courses (Excluding scholarship holders pursuant to Ministerial Decree 224 of 30.04.99 and research fellows as per Law 449 of 27/12/1997)	Be accepted onto the course
- Specialisation courses (excluding those in the medical area ex Legislative Decree 368/1999) - Health and Dentistry specialisation courses (Interministerial Decree 716 of 16/09/2016)	Be accepted onto the course

Disabled students enrolled in years following the first year

If the beneficiary is a disabled student, the number of CFUs required is reduced by 40%. A disabled student who enrolls in the 2nd supplementary year in the 2026/2027 academic year is required to meet the same merit requirement set out for students enrolled in the 1st supplementary year and will be considered a partial beneficiary, with the awarding of 50% of the scholarship and the related services.

Bonus

Students have a bonus to cover any differences between the minimum number of credits required and those actually acquired; the bonus is activated directly by the office. The amount of the bonus varies depending on the year of enrolment in which it is activated as follows:

- five credits to maintain the benefits of the first year or the attainment of the benefits for the second year of students enrolled in First Cycle, Second Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses;
- twelve credits for the attainment of the benefits for the third year of students enrolled in First Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses and the 1st supplementary year for students enrolled in Second Cycle degree courses;
- fifteen credits for the attainment of the benefits for subsequent academic years for students enrolled in First Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses.

Bonus can be activated only once during a student's career up to the award of the degree and used until the quota for the subsequent years has been consumed.

The bonus can also be used by students enrolled in the first year of First Cycle, Second Cycle, and Single Cycle degree courses who confirm eligibility for the scholarship at 50% (partial beneficiary), having attained the credits by 30 November 2027.

B) REQUIREMENTS RELATING TO THE ECONOMIC STATUS

Students' economic status is determined based on the Indicator of the Equivalent Economic Situation (ISEE – 2026) **valid for subsidised services for the Right to University Education** pursuant to Council of Ministers Presidential Decree (DPCM) No. 159 dated 5 December 2013.

Attention: ISEE declarations that do not comply (i.e., contain annotations for omissions and/or discrepancies) **will not be considered**. Non-compliance occurs when INPS, issuing the ISEE, detects omissions, discrepancies, or inconsistencies with respect to the declarations made by the applicant. For further details see Art. 11, paragraph 5 of DPCM 5 December 2013 No. 159 and Art. 3 of the Decree dated 7 November 2014.

Pursuant to DPCM 5 December 2013 No. 159 and INPS Circular No. 171 of 18 December 2014, the portion of the Right to University Study scholarship received in the 2024 calendar year must be declared for ISEE purposes. This 2023 quota must be declared in the online application and will be automatically deducted from the ISEE acquired by INPS for the student.

Students **must be in possession of an ISEE issued by INPS valid for subsidized Right to University Study benefits by the strict deadline of 24 September 2026** to allow electronic acquisition of income data.

Warning: obtaining the ISEE certificate requires several weeks; therefore, it is advisable to request the certification well in advance. **Failure to provide ISEE data will result in exclusion from the scholarship application call.**

Students requesting Right to University Study benefits must have, with reference to the family unit as defined pursuant to DPCM 5 December 2013 No. 159 and implementing Ministerial Decree 1320 of 17 December 2021:

- an Indicator of the Equivalent Capital Situation (calculated by managing bodies and corresponding to ISP/Equivalence scale, as per Section I “Calculation methods for ordinary ISEE” of the certification for university study-related services) **not exceeding € 58,452.06;**
- an Indicator of the Equivalent Economic Situation (ISEE for subsidized Right to University Study benefits) not exceeding € 26,887.93.

Independent student

Pursuant to Article 8, paragraph 2, of Council of Ministers Presidential Decree (DPCM) No. 159/2013 and Article 3, paragraph 1, of Ministerial Decree (DM) No. 1320/2021, and in order to adequately consider the parties bearing the maintenance burden of the student, the applicant's family unit is integrated with that of their parents when **both** of the following conditions are **not** met:

- Residence for at least two years prior to the date of submission of the consolidated substitute declaration outside the family of origin's household, in a dwelling not owned by any family member;
- Income from dependent or equivalent employment, not performed under a family member within the third degree of kinship, declared for tax purposes for at least two years, amounting to no less than €9,000.00.

If even one of these conditions is not satisfied, the economic and patrimonial situation of the family of origin will be taken into account.

An independent student is also considered “off-site” if they rent paid accommodation in the municipality where their degree course is held.

CURRENT ISEE

Pursuant to Article 9 of Council of Ministers Presidential Decree (DPCM) No. 159/2013, the current ISEE can be requested when, although already holding a valid ordinary ISEE, a change occurs in the employment status or there is an interruption of social security, welfare, or indemnity benefits that are not included in the overall income (declared for IRPEF purposes) for one or more members of the family unit; or when there is a reduction of more than 25% in the overall income capacity of the family unit. For further information, please contact a CAAF (Authorized Tax Assistance Centre).

Assessment of the economic and patrimonial situation for non-residents in Italy and/or those with income and assets in countries other than Italy

In this case, it is necessary to contact one of the CAFs affiliated with the University of Brescia (see the list published on the University website) to request an **Equivalent ISEE (ISEE Parificato) for subsidized University Right-to-Study benefits**. The CAF will be responsible for transmitting the Equivalent ISEE data to the University.

In this case as well, the student must obtain the **Equivalent ISEE applicable to subsidized University Right-to-Study benefits no later than the final deadline of 24 September 2026.**

The economic and patrimonial situation of the family unit must be certified with appropriate documentation issued by the competent authorities of the country where the income was generated and must be translated into Italian by the relevant Italian diplomatic authorities competent for the territory.

The economic status of foreign students or Italian students residing abroad is defined based on the provisions contained in Article 8, paragraph 5, of DPCM 159/2013, subject to different national regulations.

The economic and patrimonial condition for non-EU foreign students is assessed according to the procedures prescribed by Legislative Decree No. 286 of 25 July 1998 and subsequent amendments (Article 4, paragraphs 3 and 39) and Presidential Decree No. 394 of 31 August 1999 (Article 46, paragraph 5).

For information regarding the documentation to be submitted, it is necessary to contact one of the affiliated CAAFs (list available on the same page as the Call for Applications).

In cases where there are particular difficulties issuing the certification attested by the local Italian Embassy, the certification must be issued by the competent foreign diplomatic or consular representation in Italy and legalized by the Prefecture pursuant to Article 33 of Presidential Decree No. 445 dated 28 December 2000.

However, the student is obliged to declare any income and assets held in Italy by their family unit pursuant to DPCM 159 of 5 December 2013.

Students from 'Particularly poor and developing countries'

Foreign students coming from 'particularly poor and developing countries'—as designated by Ministerial Decree no. 176 of February 24, 2026—who do not belong to a family known to have a high income and high social status (as certified by the Italian diplomatic representation in their country of origin, by the diplomatic authorities of their country of origin in Italy, by their foreign enrollment university linked by agreements or conventions with Italian universities, or by Italian bodies authorized to guarantee financial coverage under current regulations governing the enrollment of foreign students in Italian universities), and who hold a valid visa or residence permit for study purposes, are not required to submit an ISEE Parificato (Equivalent ISEE), provided that there are no household members earning an income in Italy.

These students will be automatically placed in the first income bracket.

Political refugee or stateless students: The status of stateless or political refugee student must be self-certified with:

- a) the details of the Residence Permit for Political Asylum issued by Central Commission for the recognition of refugee status set up at the Ministry of the Interior;
- b) the details of the Certification of Statelessness issued by the Civil Court at the request of the person concerned through the appropriate administrative procedure; application for this is made through the relevant central police station.

These documents must be sent via PEC (certified mail) to ammcentr@cert.unibs.it (also from anon-PEC mail) by the expiry date of the Call (the date of reception of the PEC will provide proof of despatch). The abovementioned criteria are followed for the assessment of the economic-capital conditions, limited to the income and capital in Italy, if they exist. If there is no income and capital in Italy, the indicator of the situation is considered zero for the purposes of the Equivalent ISEE total.

Students with international/subsidiary/temporary protection (Ukraine emergency), as well as students coming from countries affected by emergency situations resulting from ongoing transnational armed conflicts (Iran emergency), who are in documented situations of economic hardship, are not required to submit an Equivalent ISEE, provided that no members of their household earn income in Italy.

In any case, the income earned abroad and declared by international students may not be lower than the minimum amount established at the national level, corresponding to the minimum means of subsistence that must be demonstrated when applying for an Italian entry visa for study purposes. This amount constitutes the minimum threshold for assessing compliance with the economic eligibility requirements.

International students are nevertheless required to declare any income and assets held in Italy in accordance with Prime Ministerial Decree (D.P.C.M.) No. 159 of 5 December 2013, by means of an ISEE certificate for benefits related to the right to university education.

Students who received a scholarship in 2024: The amount of the university study grant received during the 2024 tax year (as reported in the *Certificazione Unica*) must be declared in the ISEE University certificate. Therefore, during the online application process, students will be asked—so that a deduction can be applied in their favor—to confirm whether the scholarship amount received in 2024 from the University of Brescia was self-declared in the ISEE University certificate. Alternatively, students coming from other universities must declare any scholarship amount received and self-declared in their ISEE University certificate. The amount of the university study grant received during the 2024 tax year will be deducted automatically by dividing it by the equivalence scale and subtracting the resulting amount from the 2026 ISEE value.

Art. 8 Total of the scholarship

The total of the scholarship is differentiated both in relation to the student's geographic origin and the corresponding bracket of the university ISEE of the family unit specified in the following table:

Regularly enrolled students

Amount of scholarships, including the reimbursement of the regional tax for the Right to Study:

ON-SITE STUDENTS

- 1st income bracket: € 2.601,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 3.430,00;
- 2nd income bracket: € 2.162,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 2.991,00;
- 3rd income bracket: € 1.314,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 2.143,00.

COMMUTING STUDENTS

- 1st income bracket: € 3.991,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 4.820,00;
- 2nd income bracket: € 3.362,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 4.191,00;
- 3rd income bracket: € 2.470,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 3.299,00.

OFF-SIT STUDENTS

a) Hosted in the University of Brescia's residential facilities:

- 1st income bracket: € 4.479,00 + accommodation and one free daily meal, for a total of € 8.248,00;
- 2nd income bracket: € 3.403,00 + accommodation and one free daily meal, for a total of € 7.172,00;
- 3rd income bracket: € 2.088,00 + accommodation and one free daily meal, for a total of € 5.857,00.

b) Hosted in other public or private residential facilities:

- 1st income bracket: € 7.419,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 8.248,00;
- 2nd income bracket: € 6.343,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 7.172,00;
- 3rd income bracket: € 5.028,00 + one free daily meal, for a total of € 5.857,00.

The monetary value of the free daily meal and the free accommodation, withheld from the total amount of the scholarship, is as follows:

- lump sum for meals: € 829,00
- lump sum for accommodation: € 2,940.00

Students enrolled in the first supplementary year and part-time students

The amount of the scholarship, as defined above, for students benefiting from a scholarship for an additional year with respect to the legal length of the course starting from the first registration and part-time students are halved, just like the relative free services (canteen and accommodation).

Catering service

For information on how to access and make use of this benefit, please refer to Section 3 of this Call for Applications, entitled “Catering Service” (Servizio Ristorazione).

Geographic origin

Students are classified into three categories based on the journey time between the residence of their family unit and the location of the degree programme attended. In cases where the family unit is split across multiple residences, the travel time is calculated from the residence closest to the course location. If the student moves their residence closer to the course location, travel time is calculated from the new residence. Exceptions apply to international students with family units abroad and a study visa, as well as political refugees.

- **On-site students:** students residing in the municipality where the course is based, in a neighbouring municipality, or in any location from which the commute is within 60 minutes (see Annex 2 for Brescia-based courses).
- **Commuting students:** students residing in a municipality different from that of the course but able to commute daily within 61 to 90 minutes (see Annex 2 for Brescia-based courses).
- **Off-site students:** students residing in a municipality not considered on-site or commuting, who therefore rent accommodation (at their own expense) in a municipality located within 60 minutes of the course site, making use of university residences, public residential facilities, or private housing for a minimum period of 10 months between October 2026 and September 2027. For students enrolled for the first time in the first "fuori corso" year, the rental period must be at least 5 months between October 2026 and March 2027. Students who do not meet these conditions are considered commuting students.

By “**at their own expense**” is meant: a duly registered rental contract in the name or co-signed by the student or one of their parents; or for students staying in public or private residences, a fiscally valid receipt or certification proving payment of rent for accommodation in the city where the university course is based.

If the student takes part in an international mobility programme recognised by our University during the academic year, in order to be considered an off-site student, they must belong to a family residing in a municipality that is neither classified as “on-site” nor “commuting” and must provide a rental contract from the host country.

This document must be registered in the student's name (or co-signed) and must cover the entire mobility period. If the stay abroad only covers part of the academic year 2026/2027, the student must also submit a copy of a duly registered rental contract in Italy, so as to meet the required number of months of paid accommodation mentioned above. Upon request by the U.O.C. Borse di Studio e Benefici, the student must send the documentation via PEC email to: ammcentr@cert.unibs.it.

For students with disabilities, the journey time thresholds used to determine the classification as “on-site”, “commuting”, or “off-site” are reduced by 10 minutes.

Foreign students with a family unit abroad and a visa for study reasons, as well as political refugees, are considered off-site regardless of their residence, provided they are staying in university residences or hold a rental contract for paid accommodation as defined above. Otherwise, they will be classified as commuting students.

For students attending courses in locations other than Brescia: the student is considered on-site if residing in the same municipality as the course attended; the student is considered off-site if they declare in the online application to hold a rental contract for paid accommodation as defined above, otherwise, they are classified as commuting students.

Rental contract for off-site student status

By 1:00 PM (Italian time) on 4th November 2026, students must enter the details of their rental contract and/or valid fiscal certification proving the tacit annual renewal (for contracts valid for multiple years) in the section: “Online services application > login > Information on Boarding or Rental contract”.

Scholarship increase

To support students from more economically disadvantaged backgrounds, the amount of the scholarship awarded to students belonging to the first income bracket has already been increased by 15%.

Pursuant to Article 2, paragraph 3, of Ministerial Decree (D.M.) No. 1320/2021, students who obtain their Bachelor's Degree, Master's Degree, or Single-Cycle Master's Degree within the standard duration established by their respective academic regulations are entitled to a scholarship supplement equal to half of the scholarship received in their final year of study, net of any deductions related to accommodation and meal services.

Pursuant to Article 3, paragraph 5, of D.M. No. 1320/2021, female students enrolled in STEM degree programmes (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) are entitled to a 20% increase in their scholarship amount. As specified by Circular No. 13676/2022 of the Ministry of Universities and Research, the 20% scholarship increase for female STEM students cannot be combined with the 15% increase provided for students whose ISEE indicator is below 50% of the maximum eligibility threshold. Therefore, the 20% increase is calculated on the basis of the scholarship amount otherwise due to the student (i.e., the amount corresponding to the second or third income bracket).

Pursuant to Article 6, paragraph 3, of D.M. No. 1320/2021, students who, in accordance with current legislation, are enrolled simultaneously in more than one degree programme may obtain and retain the scholarship, increased by 20%, provided that they meet and continue to meet the academic merit requirements for the scholarship throughout the entire duration of their studies. This increase shall not be granted if the student loses eligibility for the scholarship with respect to the degree programme to which the increase is linked.

The allocation of the above-mentioned scholarship supplements to eligible students is subject to the availability of financial resources and is made following the ranking updates of eligible students, according to the following order of priority:

- a) Supplement for female STEM students (Article 3, paragraph 5, D.M. No. 1320/2021);
- b) Supplement for students enrolled simultaneously in multiple degree programmes (Article 6, paragraph 3, D.M. No. 1320/2021);
- c) “Graduation award” supplement (Article 2, paragraph 3, D.M. No. 1320/2021).

Art. 9 Integrations of scholarships

International mobility

Pursuant to Article 3, paragraph 9, of Ministerial Decree No. 1320/2021, students awarded a scholarship for Academic Year 2026/2027 and eligible non-recipient students (including PhD students) may apply for the international mobility supplement and internship support, provided that the study and/or internship period is academically recognized in terms of credits within their degree programme in Italy, including activities undertaken for the preparation of the final thesis. The contribution, based on the available allocation, amounts to Euro 600.00 per month for the duration of the stay abroad, up to a maximum of ten months.

The study programme abroad must be certified by the competent office for international exchanges at the University of Brescia.

The amount of the scholarship supplement granted to the eligible student shall be reduced by the amount of any other contributions received from European Union funds, bilateral agreements (including non-EU agreements), or funds provided by public or private organizations.

Students are also entitled to reimbursement of round-trip travel expenses up to:

- **€100.00** for European countries;
- **€500.00** for non-European countries.

Contributions for participation in international mobility programmes or internships may be granted only once for each degree programme attended.

These rights are also extended, upon request, to graduates involved in mobility projects under the European Leonardo Programme (or equivalent initiatives), provided that they graduated no more than one year before the start of the internship and were eligible for a scholarship in their final year of studies.

For scholarship recipients and eligible non-recipients, during the mobility period the meal service will be provided automatically through a meal allowance lump sum established by the Lombardy Region, or a proportionate amount corresponding to the mobility period. Students who have received the lump-sum allowance of €829 will only be entitled to access the service at the discounted rate, as specified in Section 3 of this call.

The University reserves the right to conduct appropriate checks, including on the basis of information provided by the International Student Mobility Office, and to apply sanctions as provided for in this call.

Any other periods of study abroad undertaken on the student's own initiative shall not entitle the student to any reimbursement.

Disabled students

If the beneficiary is a disabled student, the annual amount of the scholarship, net of deductions for accommodation and catering services, may be increased by up to a maximum of 40% of the entitled amount for students falling under the categories referred to in Article 1, paragraph 1, letter g), of DM no. 1320/2021, according to the degree of disability of the student.

This scholarship enhancement can, upon request sent to the PEC ammcentr@cert.unibs.it, be converted into the provision of specialized equipment and differentiated educational materials, placement in residential facilities, assignment of an escort or study assistant, interpreter, or any other tool suitable to overcome specific individual difficulties.

PLEASE NOTE: For disabled students enrolling for the 2026/2027 academic year in the 2nd supplementary year, the scholarship amounts, as defined above, shall be halved, as well as the related free services (canteen and accommodation).

Art. 10 Procedures for the formation of scholarship rankings

Rankings are formulated according to the criteria specified below, subject to attribution of the scholarship to eligible disabled students with invalidity of 66% or higher.

A) Students enrolled in the first year of:

- **First Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses (maximum 1000 points):**
 - 40% of the High School Diploma mark
 - 60% of the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE economic status

Formulae to determine 1000 points:

$$\text{High school Diploma mark} \times \frac{400}{\text{Maximum final exam mark}}$$

$$\left(1 - \left(\frac{\text{ISEE or Equivalent ISEE}}{\text{€ 26.887,93}} \right) \right) \times 600$$

When marks are equal, the younger student has precedence.

Students who obtained their diploma in a country other than Italy will be assessed according to a value shown by the application of the conversion formula adopted by the MUR (MUR note of 04/06/2007 – see Appendix 1).

- **Second Cycle degree courses (maximum of 1000 points):**
 - 40% of the mark of the First Cycle (honours are worth one point, only for Italian degree)
 - 60% from the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE economic status

Formulae to determine 1000 points:

$$\text{mark of the First Cycle} \times \frac{400}{\text{Maximum final exam mark}}$$

$$\left(1 - \left(\frac{\text{ISEE or Equivalent ISEE}}{\text{€ 26.887,93}}\right)\right) \times 600$$

When marks are equal, the younger student has precedence.

B) Students enrolled in years after the first year

The ranking order is determined, in decreasing order, from the overall points arising from the sum of the points relating to CFUs attained before 10 August 2026 and the points determined by the weighted average mark of the exams. There are an overall 1000 points attributable, distributed thus: 600 based on the number of CFUs acquired and 400 based on the weighted average mark of the exams passed (eligibility is not included in the calculation).

The points for CFUs awarded by 10 August 2026 are calculated respectively according to the following formulae:

$$(\text{student credits} - \text{minimum credits}) \times \frac{600}{(\text{maximum credits} - \text{minimum credits})}$$

$$(\text{average student mark} - \text{minimum mark}) \times \frac{400}{(\text{maximum mark} - \text{minimum mark})}$$

If the merit points are equal, the student with the lower ISEE/Equivalent ISEE value precedes in the ranking. If there are still equal points, the younger student has the precedence.

C) PhD courses

(excluding scholarship beneficiaries pursuant to Ministerial Decree 224 of 30.04.99 and research fellowships as per Law 449 of 27.12.1997), **Specialisation courses** (excluding those in the medical area ex Legislative Decree 368/1999), **Health and Dentistry Specialisation courses** (Interministerial Decree 716, 16/09/2016).

The ranking order is determined by the score:

- 40% of the degree mark (honours are worth one point)
- 60% from the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE economic status

Formulae to determine 1000 points:

$$\text{Mark of degree awarded} \times \frac{400}{\text{Maximum degree mark}}$$

$$\left(1 - \left(\frac{ISEE \text{ or Equivalent } ISEEU}{€ 26.887,93}\right)\right) \times 600$$

When marks are equal, the younger student has precedence.

D) ‘Suspended’ status students

The following will be included in the provisional list and/or the ranking (and subsequent updates) with ‘suspended’ status:

- students who intend to graduate by the last session of the 2025/2026 academic year;
- students transferring from another university and/or degree course, awaiting the definition of merit (i.e. the validation of the CFUs relating to the new degree course);
- students involved in International Mobility in the 2025/2026 academic year, awaiting the definition of merit (validation of the exams taken abroad);
- students who have not yet completed their enrolment in the 2026/2027 academic year.

Students participating in the filter semester (so-called "simultaneous enrolment students"), who applied according to the ordinary deadlines, will be placed in a separate and subsequent ranking (so-called "second semester scholarship ranking") with a ‘suspended’ status (pending the results of the filter semester and their enrolment).

Art. 11 Requests for rectification and publication of the scholarship ranking

A provisional list, which only defines the student’s theoretical position of ‘eligibility’ / ‘exclusion’ / ‘suspension’, will be published by 22 October 2026 through the university website www.unibs.it > OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES > RIGHT TO STUDY > SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS > DSU CALLS > Call for applications for access to Right to Study Services – A.Y. 2026/2027 > ONLINE SERVICES APPLICATION.

Any request for rectification of this provisional list must be submitted strictly within 15 days from the date of its publication by accessing the website www.unibs.it > OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES > RIGHT TO STUDY > SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS > DSU CALLS > Call for applications for access to Right to Study Services – A.Y. 2026/2027 > ONLINE SERVICES APPLICATION > RANKING OUTCOME > Requests for Rectification.

The final ranking, which establishes the right of ‘eligible’ students to receive the scholarship based on the number of available grants, as previously defined, will be published by **25th November 2026** through the online university notice board and at www.unibs.it > **OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES > RIGHT TO STUDY > SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS > DSU CALLS** > Call for applications for access to Right to Study Services – A.Y. 2026/2027 > **ONLINE SERVICES APPLICATION > RANKING OUTCOME**.

The publication of the ranking and its subsequent updates on the university website is the only official legal means of notification regarding the outcome of the Call.

From 26th November 2026 to 30th June 2027, the ranking will be updated based on newly acquired data, including updates regarding students with a ‘suspended’ status in the November ranking.

PLEASE NOTE: students will receive a notification of each ranking update at their institutional e-mail address assigned by the University (domain students.unibs.it). The e-mail address provided during the application process will not be used.

WARNING: Students are strongly advised to regularise their enrolment for the 2026/2027 academic year as soon as possible to avoid being assigned a 'suspended' status.

Art. 12 Assignment, tax exemption and fees, method of payment and revocation of scholarship

Assignments

Scholarships are initially distributed according to the percentage of eligible students in each category compared to the total number, rounded to the nearest whole number, based on data from the academic year preceding the current Call.

For the 2026/2027 a.y. ranking, the percentages are as follows:

- 28,98 % to first-year students enrolled in First Cycle and Single Cycle degree courses;
- 8,11 % to first-year students enrolled in Second Cycle degree courses;
- 62,61 % to students enrolled in years after the first year;
- 0,30 % to Ph.D. students and students enrolled in Specialisation Schools.

The allocation of scholarships within the categories defined above shall be carried out as follows:

• **Students enrolled in the first year:** The number of scholarships available shall be allocated according to the students' position in the ranking list, determined on the basis of academic merit and financial condition, with separate rankings for students enrolled in Bachelor's Degree and Single-Cycle Master's Degree programmes and those enrolled in Master's Degree programmes.

• **Students enrolled in years following the first year:** The ranking list shall be divided by degree programme and by the academic year of the student's first enrolment, in accordance with the applicable programme structure. The allocation of scholarships shall be made proportionally, based on the number of eligible students within each group (identified by cohort and degree programme) in relation to the total number of eligible students.

• **PhD Programmes and Specialization Schools:** The number of scholarships available shall be allocated according to the students' position in the ranking list, determined on the basis of academic merit and financial condition.

Exemption from university taxes

Students who meet the financial eligibility and academic merit requirements established by this call for applications for the award of a scholarship (hereinafter referred to as Eligible Students) are granted a full exemption from university tuition fees and contributions.

Students who are eligible for a scholarship and are enrolled in the year following the final regular year of their degree programme, with reference to their year of initial enrolment, as well as first-year students who retain eligibility for only 50% of the scholarship benefit, are granted a 50% reduction in the university fees and contributions due.

The Regional Right-to-Study Tax remains payable. For Academic Year 2026/2027, pursuant to Article 6 of Lombardy Regional Law No. 13/2025, this tax is charged according to three different income brackets, based on the student's financial condition.

Method of payment:

Scholarships are exempt from Income Tax as set out by Circular 109/E of 6 April 1995 of the Minister of Finance. Scholarships can be combined with contributions for periods of study abroad.

The scholarship grant will preferably be paid through the Student Card issued by Crédit Agricole, the Treasury Bank of the University of Brescia. The Student Card is the University's official card, which allows students to access a range of university services and is provided after enrollment. The card can be activated by the student free of charge. It can be activated free of charge by the student. For activation and further information, please consult: www.unibs.it/it/student-card

For activation instructions and further information, please visit: www.unibs.it/en/student-card.

Alternatively, the scholarship may be credited to another bank account, provided that the account is held or jointly held by the student beneficiary.

Students must **enter/check** the IBAN code and banking details of the Crédit Agricole current account (upon activation) into which the scholarship will be paid. Failure to do so will result in the suspension of the payment.

To complete these steps, students must access their personal area on the university portal at: "Home > Personal Data > Change payment and reimbursement data – Use the link to modify the data to receive payments or reimbursements."

- **Students enrolled in the first year:**

The first instalment of the scholarship, amounting to 50% of the total amount due, will be paid to scholarship beneficiaries by 31st December 2026. An intermediate instalment equal to 15% of the scholarship amount will be paid by 10th April 2027 to students who have acquired at least 15 CFUs by 31st March 2027 (intermediate requirement). The balance of the scholarship will be paid only if the student confirms, in accordance with their Study Plan, that they have attained the number of CFUs required under this Call, as follows:

- If the required CFUs are attained by 10th August 2027, the balance will be paid and the student will be considered a 100% beneficiary, with full exemption from university fees and entitlement to free services (accommodation and/or catering). This payment will be made starting from September 2027.
- If the required CFUs are attained by 30th November 2027, the student will retain entitlement to 50% of the scholarship amount already received and will be considered a partial beneficiary, with a 50% exemption from university fees based on their ISEE. In such cases, the student will also be required to pay: ○ 50% of the accommodation service cost, if applicable; ○ 50% of the catering service used through the electronic meal allowance system. ○ The 15% intermediate instalment previously received must be repaid.
- If the required CFUs are not attained by 30th November 2027, the scholarship will be revoked and the student will be considered not eligible. They will be required to repay all scholarship funds received, reimburse the amount used through the electronic meal allowance system, and pay for any accommodation service received at the rate applicable to the 4th income bracket. University fees and contributions will be payable according to the student's ISEE.

'Eligible non-beneficiary' students must also comply with the above requirements in order to maintain their eligibility status.

- **Students enrolled in years following the first year:**

- The first instalment of the scholarship, equal to 50% of the total monetary amount awarded, will be paid to beneficiaries by 31st December 2026;
- The second instalment of the scholarship will be paid to beneficiaries by 30th June 2027, subject to the actual availability of funds.

All students concerned will be notified of the successful payment by email sent to their institutional university email address.

- **Students who graduate in the 2025/2026 academic year:** Any student who graduates in a session of the 2025/2026 academic year and has received a scholarship awarded for the 2026/2027 academic year must repay the scholarship in full. In addition, they will be required to reimburse any accommodation and/or catering services used, as specified in the relevant sections of this Call, since graduation results in the automatic termination of enrolment for the 2026/2027 academic year.

Revocations

Right to the scholarship is revoked if:

- a. the student enrolled in the first year of First Cycle, Second Cycle or Single Cycle degree courses does not attain the merit requirement set out in Art. 7 by 30th November 2027;
- b. the University determines that the information declared by the student through self-certification is untrue, resulting in the loss of the academic merit and/or financial eligibility requirements established by this Call;
- c. the student submits a withdrawal request or transfers to another university during the 2026/2027 Academic Year before 11th August 2027;
- d. a student already enrolled for the 2026/2027 Academic Year subsequently obtains their degree with reference to the 2025/2026 Academic Year and does not enrol in a Master's Degree, Single-Cycle Master's Degree, Specialization School, or PhD programme;
- e. a student whose scholarship eligibility is conditional upon completion of enrolment in a PhD programme, Specialization School, or first year of a Master's Degree programme has not completed enrolment for the 2026/2027 Academic Year by the final enrolment deadline for that Academic Year;
- f. serious discrepancies are identified in the student's academic record compared with the information declared.

The above-mentioned students shall have the scholarship revoked and shall be required to:

- repay any scholarship amounts received in cash;
- reimburse the accommodation service, if used, at the rate applicable to the 4th income bracket (the relevant fees are published on the University's website), as well as the amount used through the electronic meal allowance system for catering services;
- pay any university fees and contributions due in accordance with the relevant Regulations.

The University of Brescia may enter into agreements establishing repayment procedures, including instalment plans, upon request by the student submitted to the University's certified email address (PEC): ammcentr@cert.unibs.it.

If the student fails to return the sums due by the deadline indicated on the IUV payment forms, a block will be placed on the student's academic career, without prejudice to any additional legal consequences.

If, after the second payment notice, the student still results as a debtor, the Right to Study Office is required to notify and forward the case to the University Legal Office.

Art. 13 Procedures for the allocation of DSU benefits for students participating in the filter semester

Students enrolled in the filter semester must apply for the scholarship following the standard procedures, methods and deadlines, which are the same as those applied to students not enrolled in the filter semester, for all DSU benefits they wish to access in the 2026/2027 academic year.

Students participating in the filter semester (so-called "concurrently enrolled students"), who submit their application within the ordinary deadlines, will be placed in a subsequent and separate ranking list (so-called "second semester scholarship ranking") with a "suspended" status (pending the outcome of the filter semester and enrolment).

Following the publication of the national ranking for Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine referred to in Art. 10 of Ministerial Decree no. 941/2026, an additional application window will be opened for the allocation of scholarship benefits and DSU services (housing and catering) for students who participated in the filter semester at other universities or in other regions and who, based on the results of the national selection, enrol in a different study programme. Only these students will be allowed to submit an online application from 19 January 2027 to 5 March 2027, unless extended.

After publication of the provisional list, students may submit a request for rectification, following the same procedures and deadlines set for the first ranking.

Subsequently, the second semester ranking list will be drawn up for the scholarship and catering service – and, if requested, for the housing service – according to the requirements, formulas and ranking criteria already specified in the relevant sections of this Call and used for the initial rankings. This new ranking will include:

- students in suspended status who applied within the ordinary deadlines, and
- students whose eligible applications were submitted during the additional time window.

After that, the first instalment of the scholarship will be paid to the students who are successfully placed in the ranking.

The amount of the scholarship granted after enrolment in the second semester will be equal to the full annual amount. For off-site students, the housing allowance will be calculated based on the number of months covered by a paid accommodation contract, provided it is no less than three months.

Students enrolled in the filter semester can benefit from catering and housing services only after enrolment in the second semester at the University of Brescia and only if they meet the specific requirements set out in the respective sections and are successfully placed in the relevant ranking.

It is specified that the specific financial reserves allocated for scholarships of students participating in the filter semester cannot be used to finance scholarships for candidates whose ISEE value is equal to or higher than that of the highest-ranking eligible non-beneficiary student in the general ranking. In such cases, selection will proceed from the general ranking list.

Students included in the second semester scholarship ranking based on their application submitted by the ordinary deadline will be excluded from that ranking if, at the end of the filter semester, they enrol in the second semester at a different university.

For these students, the achievement of the merit requirements for first-year students, as required by current legislation, will be verified. Based on the outcome, either the balance of the scholarship will be paid, or recovery procedures will be initiated to reclaim amounts unduly received through the first instalment and to collect any adjustments for services used, in the same way as for all other students, as detailed in the relevant articles.

From the second academic year onwards, students who participated in the filter semester will be subject to the ordinary procedures and deadlines for the allocation of DSU benefits.

Art. 14 Ascertaining the truthfulness of self-certifications

The University, for the purpose of verifying the self-certified data, will make use of the powers granted by current legislation, in particular Presidential Decree No. 445 of 28 December 2000 and Prime Ministerial Decree 159/2013, including requesting any documentation useful for verifying the truthfulness of the declarations made (e.g., Mod. 730, Mod. Unico, VAT return, rental contract, etc.).

The University of Brescia, in agreement with INPS, the Italian Revenue Agency, the Regional Directorate of Lombardy, the Ministry of Finance, as well as the Financial Police (Guardia di Finanza), carries out substantive checks on the truthfulness of all self-certifications submitted by students who are beneficiaries of monetary benefits or services granted through competitive selection, as well as automatic checks on all students belonging to families with zero income, applying current legislation, in particular Article 71 of Presidential Decree 445/2000 and Prime Ministerial Decree 159/2013.

In case of false declarations, the sanctions provided for in Articles 75 and 76 of Presidential Decree 445/2000, as well as the sanctions under Article 10 of Legislative Decree 68/2012, will be applied.

The adoption of disciplinary sanctions and the report to the judicial authorities will be without prejudice, should criminal offenses be identified (Article 331 of the Code of Criminal Procedure).

The verification of economic conditions is also carried out for all students who benefit from the University of Brescia's accommodation and catering services at subsidized rates.

SECTION 2: ACCOMMODATION SERVICE

Art. 15 General conditions for taking part in the competition for accommodation services

The Accommodation Service is available from **1st September 2026 to 31st July 2027**; all residences are located in Brescia.

All students enrolled or intending to enrol in courses at the University of Brescia for the **2026/2027** academic year, with their course based in Brescia, may apply for a place in the residences.

Students enrolled in Ph.D. programmes must submit their application for Accommodation Service through a specific dedicated Call published on the University website at www.unibs.it > OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES > RIGHT TO STUDY > SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS > DSU CALLS.

Students enrolled in medical Specialisation Schools governed by Legislative Decree 368/99, Single Courses, Specialisation Courses, or Foundation Year programmes are excluded from the accommodation

service. Also excluded are all students with outstanding debts or pending payments to the University of Brescia as of the date of publication of the ranking and at the time of confirming beneficiary status, unless different instalment agreements have been signed.

NOTE: Applications for services may be submitted even before the formal enrolment or registration for the **2026/2027** academic year, and prior to taking any admission tests.

To apply, visit www.unibs.it > OPPORTUNITIES AND SERVICES > RIGHT TO STUDY > SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS > DSU CALLS > Call for Application for Access to the Right to Study Services - **A.Y. 2026/2027** > Online Services Application – Accommodation Service, following the instructions provided and confirming the application by the deadlines indicated in this Call.

The maximum number of accommodation places available for the **2026/2027** academic year is **240** and will be assigned as follows:

- To **“Returning students”** (those already accommodated in the **2025/2026** academic year, classified as **Off-site** students, and meeting the scholarship eligibility requirements for **2025/2026** and the merit requirement for **2026/2027**).

The remaining available places will be distributed as follows:

- **35%** reserved for students enrolled beyond the first year in First Cycle, Single Cycle, Second Cycle degree courses, or Specialisation Schools in the **2026/2027** academic year, who do not fall under the “Returning students” category;
- **65%** reserved for first-year students newly enrolled in First Cycle, Single Cycle, Second Cycle degree courses, or Specialisation Schools in the **2026/2027** academic year, who are not “Returning students”.

Preferences expressed in the online application regarding the choice of residence and type of accommodation will be considered within the limits of available beds and safety protocols adopted. Accommodation will be allocated automatically according to the ranking order.

Art. 16 Acceptance by the Accommodation Service

Online applications must be submitted and confirmed by the following strict deadlines:

- **Returning students** (students accommodated in the **2025/2026** academic year, classified as **Off-site** and meeting the scholarship eligibility requirements for **2025/2026** and the merit requirements for **2026/2027**):
 - Confirm the online application by **20th August 2026 at 1:00 PM (Italian time zone)**
 - The list of eligible candidates will be published by **27th August 2026**
 - Check-in at accommodation from **1st September 2026 to 7th September 2026**

Please note that students will be re-assigned their previous accommodation place from the **2025/2026** academic year if available, except for different service needs.

Students who apply for the "Returning students" ranking, despite not meeting the requirements for confirmation, will be automatically placed in the relevant ranking list referred to in the following points.

- **Students enrolled in years following the first year:**
 - Confirm the online application by **20th August 2026 at 1:00 PM (Italian time zone)** and submit a valid ISEE or Equivalent ISEE certification (the latter issued exclusively by a partnered CAAF) by the same date, so that the economic condition requirement can be assessed for ranking purposes. In the absence of such certification or if it exceeds the limits set in Art. 8, only merit requirements will be considered.
 - The ranking will be published by **28th August 2026**
 - Check-in at accommodation from **7th September 2026 to 14th September 2026**

Please note that students who apply for a different ranking list, despite meeting the requirements for confirmation, will be automatically placed in the "Returning students" ranking and will be re-assigned their previous accommodation place from the **2025/2026** academic year if available, except for different service needs.

- **First-year students:**
 - Confirm the online application by **20th August 2026 at 1:00 PM (Italian time zone)** and submit a valid ISEE or Equivalent ISEE certification (the latter issued exclusively by a partnered CAAF) by the same date for assessment of the economic condition requirement for ranking. In the absence of such certification or if it exceeds the limits set in Art. 8, only merit requirements will be considered.
 - The ranking will be published by **11th September 2026**
 - Check-in at accommodation from **16th September 2026 to 22nd September 2026**

Please note that students who apply for a different ranking list, despite meeting the requirements for confirmation, will be automatically placed in the "Returning students" ranking and will be re-assigned their previous accommodation place from the **2025/2026** academic year if available, except for different service needs.

Failure to check in by the above deadlines will be automatically considered as a withdrawal from the accommodation service for the entire academic year.

In the case of international students allocated a bed who are awaiting visa issuance, the strict deadline for check-in may be postponed until **30th November 2026** upon submission of a documented written request, provided that the obligation to pay accommodation fees will still commence from the check-in date initially communicated by the Competent Office.

Beyond **30th November 2026**, if check-in is not completed, the student will lose their allocation. Subsequently, accommodation may be allocated to the student, upon explicit request, only within the limits of room availability at the time of their actual housing needs.

Art. 17 Ordering and criteria for the formation of the accommodation service ranking

The order in the rankings for access to the accommodation service is defined as follows:

- **A. Disabled students** meeting the merit requirements defined in the Scholarship section (ranked in ascending order of ISEE/Equivalent ISEE).

- **B. Off-site students**
 1. Students meeting both the merit and economic requirements defined in the Scholarship section.
 2. Students meeting only the merit requirement defined in the Scholarship section.
- **C. Commuting students**
 1. Students meeting both the merit and economic requirements defined in the Scholarship section.
 2. Students meeting only the merit requirement defined in the Scholarship section.
- **D. On-site students**
 1. Students meeting both the merit and economic requirements defined in the Scholarship section.
 2. Students meeting only the merit requirement defined in the Scholarship section.
- **E. Students not meeting the merit and economic requirements**, whose ranking will be formulated based on the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE. In the absence of an ISEE certification, the student will be placed at the bottom of the ranking in ascending order of age.

WARNING: These students may access the residences only after the formulation of the second-semester ranking for students enrolled in the filter semester, and only if there are remaining available accommodation places after assigning places to scholarship recipients.

Rankings published on the dates indicated in this Call may be amended following requests verified by the Office and the Procedure Manager.

Art. 18 Documents required for acceptance of accommodation

Students eligible for accommodation, in order to check into the residences, must submit at the Reception the following documents:

- a) receipt of payment of deposit (for new guests);
- b) receipt of payment of the first instalment of university enrolment fees;
- c) valid identity document.

Art. 19 Method of payment for the accommodation service

1. All students not applying for the scholarship pay the accommodation costs as per the **4th income bracket**, basing on the type of room assigned (see the Accommodation Service Tariffs published on the University website), regardless of their ISEE/Equivalent ISEE.
2. Students applying for the scholarship (BDS) pay as follows:
 - **Pending publication of the BDS ranking of November 2026:** Flat rate of **€ 130.00 per month** for the period from September to November 2026.
 - **Following publication of the BDS ranking, so from December 2026 and further updates, for all 'Off-site' guests:**
 - **For beneficiaries:**

- **Years following the first year 100% BDS:** nothing is due; the amount paid will be automatically reimbursed.
- **Years following the first year 50% BDS:** tuition fees are due according to the ISEE income bracket for the period from September 2026 to February 2027. Any necessary adjustments will therefore be made in relation to the amount paid under the flat-rate fee.
- **First-year students:** they keep on paying the flat rate until **July 2027**.
 - If 100% of the BDS is confirmed: all the payments made will be automatically reimbursed;
 - If 50% of the BDS is confirmed: the amount paid will be adjusted at 50% compared to the amount due in the income bracket based on the type of room assigned;
 - If the scholarship is lost, all the accommodation service will be adjusted at the cost of the **4th income bracket**.
- **Eligible non-beneficiary students:**
 - **Years following the first year eligible for 100% and 50% BDS:** They keep on paying the flat-rate fee until the last update of the scholarship ranking. If eligible non-beneficiary status is confirmed, any adjustment will be due in the same ISEE/Equivalent ISEE bracket as the amount paid.
 - **First-year students:** they keep on paying the flat-rate fee until the last update of the scholarship ranking. Following the check on the CFUs (automatically made from September 2027 on) to confirm eligibility for the scholarship:
 - If eligible non-beneficiary status is confirmed, the payment will be based on the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE bracket, and adjustments will be made for the whole rental period.
 - If eligibility for the scholarship is lost, all the accommodation service has to be settled at the cost of the **4th income bracket**, integrating payments made.
- **Non-eligible students:**
 - They have to pay the boarding costs as per the **4th income bracket**; adjustments will be made if necessary.
- **Following the publication of the scholarship ranking, so from December 2026 on and further updates, for all the ‘Commuting’ and ‘On-site’ guests:**
 - **Beneficiary or eligible non-beneficiary students:** payment is due basing on the ISEE/Equivalent ISEE bracket, so adjustments will be made with respect to the flat-rate fee paid.
 - **Non-eligible students:** payment is due as per the **4th income bracket**, so adjustments will be made with respect to the flat-rate fee paid.

Students **“suspended”** from the scholarship ranking: continue to pay the flat-rate fee until their status is defined as beneficiary, eligible non-beneficiary, or non-eligible, and the corresponding amount due is determined as outlined above.

Scholarship holder guests who leave the residence early and do not use the accommodation service for the entire period are not entitled to any reimbursement of the amount withheld as a flat-rate fee.

If a student vacates the accommodation before their scholarship status is defined, while still paying the flat-rate fee, they will be required to immediately settle the accommodation service at the cost of the **4th income bracket**.

Scholarship holder guests who, following the scrolling of the rankings, check into the residence after the dates indicated in the Call and its related Appendices will still be charged the entire flat-rate fee.

Accommodation fees are available on the page: **Accommodation Service Tariffs for Students**.

Please note that fees may be subject to revision during the academic year of reference.

NB: fees are halved in the following cases:

- Check-in from the 16th day of the month
- Check-out by the 16th day of the month

Students who intend to permanently leave the residence before the end of the accommodation period (including due to withdrawal from studies or graduation) must give written notice to the **UOC Scholarships and Benefits** by opening a ticket via the [INFOSTUDENTE](#) platform, at least **2 months in advance**.

Please note that the two-month notice period starts from the month following the one in which the notice is submitted (e.g., to leave the residence in April, the notice must be sent by the end of February). Failure to provide timely notice will result in a charge equivalent to the rent due for the same period (non-fractionable), which may be deducted from the security deposit.

Students involved in International Mobility Projects:

- **If the student is a scholarship holder with off-site status** and benefits from accommodation covered by the flat-rate fee, no reimbursement will be issued for the period spent abroad.
- **If the student is not a scholarship holder, or is a scholarship holder with on-site or commuter status** (i.e., accommodation NOT covered by the flat-rate fee), they can choose between:
 - keeping the assigned room during the mobility period and paying the full monthly rent;
 - clearing the room of all personal belongings during the period spent abroad and paying only for the months in which the room is occupied. Upon return from the International Mobility, the student is guaranteed a bed in any room, which may be in a different room or building than previously assigned.

This choice and the period spent abroad must be communicated in advance (no later than the month prior to departure) and strictly in writing to the **UOC Scholarships and Benefits** by opening a ticket through the [INFOSTUDENTE](#) platform.

If the student does not return by the initially communicated date, no accommodation is guaranteed, and access to the residence will be granted only if places are still available.

The final deadline for returning to the residence is set for **15th July 2027**. Students returning from mobility after this date will not be eligible for university accommodation allocation.

Art. 20 Procedures for the Allocation of Benefits for Students Participating in the “Filter Semester”

Students enrolled in the Filter Semester are not entitled to the accommodation service, but may submit their application according to the standard procedures, methods and deadlines — the same as those applied to students not enrolled in the Filter Semester.

Students participating in the Filter Semester (so-called "simultaneously enrolled students") who applied within the standard deadlines will be included in a separate and subsequent accommodation ranking, placed in a suspended status (pending the outcome of the Filter Semester and final enrolment).

Following the publication of the national ranking list for Medicine, Dentistry, and Veterinary Medicine pursuant to Art. 10 of Ministerial Decree (D.M.) 941/2026, the application terms will be reopened through an additional application window. This window is for granting competition benefits related to scholarships and DSU (Right to University Education) services for housing and catering to students who participated in the filter semester in other regions or at other universities within the Region and who, based on the competition results, enroll in a different degree program: only these students will be allowed to submit an online application from **January 19, 2027, until March 5, 2027**, unless extended.

The formulation of the second-semester ranking list for the housing service will proceed based on the requirements and order set forth in the specific article, just as with the first ranking lists. This list will include the applications of students under suspended status who applied for the housing service within the ordinary deadlines, by integrating eligible applications received during the additional application window mentioned above.

A reserve of **5 accommodation places** (which may be increased based on the actual availability of vacant accommodation places) is established for students of the filter semester enrolled at our University for the second semester, to be assigned according to the ranking order.

Please note that if, following verification of the achievement of the merit levels required for first-year students by current regulations, the scholarship is revoked, a request for any outstanding balances (retroactive adjustments) for the services used will also be issued, as is the case for all other students and as detailed in the specific articles.

Students included in the second-semester ranking list by virtue of their participation through the ordinary deadlines will be excluded from this ranking list if, upon completion of the filter semester, they enroll for the second semester at a different University.

SECTION 3: CATERING SERVICE

Art. 21 Application method and conditions of access to the catering service

The catering service is accessible to all students enrolled at the University of Brescia whose course centre is located in Brescia.

The catering service may be provided via direct or indirect management, agreements with external providers, monetary credit corresponding to the amount deducted from the scholarship (equal to €829.00 for the A.Y. 2026/2027), or via vouchers, meal tickets, or similar.

That said, the delivery method is decided by the University. Therefore, the economic benefit deriving from the catering service cannot under any circumstances be converted into money, vouchers, meal coupons, or similar at the student's request.

The current procedures for using the catering service of the University of Brescia are available on the website at the page: <https://www.unibs.it/it/opportunita-e-servizi/servizi-diritto-allo-studio/ristorazione>.

The service may be suspended during class breaks, subject to prior notification to users.

For students who benefit from the catering service based on the scholarship ranking results of the A.Y. 2025/2026, the rights granted on the basis of said ranking will remain active until 31 December 2026.

Art. 22 Methods of fruition and costs of the catering service

(Electronic purse – Discounted tariff list – Controlled tariff list)

The service will be accessible to all students, including those who did not apply for the scholarship, by paying the service provider directly for meals, which will be charged at controlled tariff list prices, without using the "UniBS.EAT" app or the QR CODE.

For students who submitted a scholarship application for the A.Y. 2026/2027, the catering service will be automatically activated via the "UniBS.EAT" app and the QR CODE, following an email notification sent by the UOC Scholarships and Benefits confirming the activation of the service, according to the procedures described below:

- Until 31 December 2026 (except as already specified in the previous Art. 21), a discounted tariff list will apply to meals compared to the operator's controlled tariff list price;
- From 1 January 2027, the catering service will be activated, as specified below, based on the results of the scholarship allocation (see Scholarship Section) according to the ranking list published in November 2026 and subsequent updates.

The QR CODE functionality of students classified as "Beneficiary", "Eligible non-beneficiary", or "Suspended" in the scholarship ranking lists (hereinafter BDS), with an active career status for the A.Y.

2026/2027, when presented at the cash desk of the University canteens, will grant the student the following methods of use:

- For **"Beneficiaries"** (first-year and subsequent years) or **"Eligible non-beneficiaries"** (subsequent years) entitled to **100% BDS**, the **"Electronic purse"** (Borsellino elettronico) will be activated on their profile:
 - For the calendar year 2027, during the months included in the calendar published on the website at the CATERING page, €100.00 will be credited to the electronic purse (on the 1st of each month), to be spent at the university canteens in one or more transactions within the reference month;
 - Once the monthly limit of €100.00 is reached, it will be possible to use the catering service at the discounted tariff list rate, pending the next automatic top-up;
 - Any monthly amount not spent by the end of the reference month will be reset to zero and cannot be used in subsequent periods under any circumstances;
 - The top-up of the electronic purse will be active according to the calendar published on the CATERING page.
- For **"Beneficiaries"** or **"Eligible non-beneficiaries"** entitled to **50% BDS** (subsequent years, final first "out-of-course" year and/or part-time), the **"Electronic purse"** will be activated on their profile:
 - For the calendar year 2027, during the months included in the calendar published on the website at the CATERING page, €50.00 will be credited to the electronic purse (on the 1st of each month), to be spent at the university canteens in one or more transactions within the reference month;
 - Once the monthly limit of €50.00 is reached, it will be possible to use the catering service at the discounted tariff list rate, pending the next automatic top-up;
 - Any monthly amount not spent by the end of the reference month will be reset to zero and cannot be used in subsequent periods under any circumstances;
 - The top-up of the electronic purse will be active according to the calendar published on the CATERING page.
- For **"Eligible non-beneficiary"** students (first-year) and **"Suspended"** students (first-year or subsequent years), the discounted tariff list for meals compared to the operator's controlled tariff list price will be activated on their profile.

"Non-eligible" students or those who did not apply for the BDS, regardless of their level of studies, may use the catering service by paying the service provider directly for meals, which will be charged at controlled tariff list prices, without using the UniBS.EAT app and therefore without the QR CODE.

These benefits will be accessible via the "UniBS.EAT" app and the QR CODE generated after pairing the user profile with the app, following the instructions published on the website at the CATERING page (link: <https://www.unibs.it/it/opportunita-e-servizi/servizi-diritto-allo-studio/ristorazione>).

Students eligible for the scholarship who do not use the catering service are not entitled to any refund.

Please note that service conditions and rates may be subject to changes during the academic year.

Return of the electronic purse due to loss of scholarship eligibility

If a student who is "Eligible" for the A.Y. 2026/2027 scholarship (at 100% or 50%) has their electronic purse benefit revoked for any reason (e.g. disqualification, academic checks, financial audits, ex-post requirement checks for first-year students, transfers, etc.) and has used the electronic purse based on the scholarship allocation, they will be required to return the amount used from the electronic purse.

Students involved in International Mobility Programs:

For students who, based on the results of the scholarship allocation, would be entitled to the activation of the electronic purse and who self-certified their participation in international mobility programs in the online application for the scholarship service, access to the catering service will be activated for the A.Y. 2026/2027 at the discounted tariff list rate, as the catering lump-sum payment established by the Lombardy Region will be automatically paid (see relevant scholarship section – Art. 9).

The University reserves the right to conduct checks, including those based on data received from the U.O.C. International Student Mobility, and to apply any applicable sanctions.

Students whose course centre is outside Brescia:

For students enrolled in degree programs whose course centre is outside Brescia, who would be entitled to the activation of the electronic purse based on the results of the scholarship allocation, the catering lump-sum payment established by the Lombardy Region will be automatically paid.

Art. 23 Students Participating in the Filter Semester

Pending the definition of the A.Y. 2026/2027 scholarship ranking list, students participating in the filter semester may use the catering service by paying the operator directly for meals, which will be charged at controlled tariff list prices, without using the UniBS.EAT app and therefore without the QR CODE.

Following the publication of the ranking list for students participating in the filter semester (so-called "Second Semester Scholarship"), they will be able to use the catering service based on their outcome under the conditions indicated in Art. 22, with any specific schedule for the top-up period of the electronic purse.

Art. 24 Validity of the benefit

The service activated in the 2026/2027 a. y. expires on 31 December 2027, subject to the conditions according to which the student loses the benefit throughout the year (e.g. graduation, withdrawal from studies, transfer, etc.)

Art. 25 Catering service: sanctions

The following are considered punishable behaviours:

1. Possession and/or use of a non-personal electronic device for accessing the catering service;
2. Transfer of the electronic device used for the catering service to third parties;
3. Refusal to show the electronic device and a valid identity document to University officials, authorised personnel, or restaurateurs upon request;
4. Failure to report the theft or loss of the electronic device used for the catering service within 3 days of the event by opening a ticket through the [INFOSTUDENTE](#) platform;

5. Any behaviour that hinders the orderly use of the service or interferes with its proper functioning.

Should one or more of the above situations or behaviours be verified on the part of the user, the following sanctions are established:

- a) Warning** (for the first occurrence as per points 3, 4, and 5);
- b) Temporary ban from accessing the canteen service for one month** (for the first occurrence as per points 1 and 2, and for repeated infractions of points 3, 4, and 5);
- c) Revocation of access to the canteen service for the entire academic year** (for repeated infractions of points 1, 2, and 5).

Sanctions are imposed by Rector's decree and follow the procedures established by the current Student Regulations.

SECTION 4: COMMON REGULATIONS

Art. 26 Privacy policy

The processing of the personal data provided by candidates for the purposes mentioned above is carried out in accordance with Legislative Decree No. 196/2003 (Personal Data Protection Code), as subsequently amended and supplemented, and in compliance with the EU Regulation - General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

The Data Controller is the University of Brescia, represented by the Rector, who has appointed Liguria Digitale S.p.A. as Data Protection Officer (DPO), represented by Mr. Maurizio Pastore, who can be contacted via email at rpdp@unibs.it.

Underage candidates must read the privacy notice carefully together with their parents or legal guardians before providing any personal data to the University. The legal representatives of underage users may exercise their rights by writing to rpdp@unibs.it.

The personal data provided by candidates when applying for this Call will be processed solely for the purpose of carrying out the selection procedure. Processing will be carried out by the staff responsible for managing the procedure, including through the use of IT systems, in the manner and within the limits strictly necessary for the purposes described above, including in the case of communication to third parties.

Data processing may also be carried out by the following entities:

Annex 1: MIUR NOTE 04/06/2007 FORMULA FOR ASSESSMENT OF HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA MARK NOT ACHIEVED IN ITALY

The mathematical formulas applied by Italian Universities are published below. These are based on the guidelines previously issued by MURST and confirmed by the Ministry of Universities and Research (MUR) in the official note dated June 4, 2007, for the evaluation of secondary school final grades obtained by foreign citizens.

1) For Belgium:

$$I.m. = \frac{(D.m. - Min.m.)}{(Max.m. - Min.m.)} \times 40 + 60$$

where:

D.m. = Diploma mark of the European country

Min.m. = minimum mark in the European country's system

I.m. = Italian equivalent mark

Max. m. = maximum mark in the European country's system

The numbers 40 and 60 refer respectively to:

- 40: the number of points in the Italian system minus one;
- 60: the minimum passing grade in the Italian system.

2) For all other countries, two scenarios are possible:

a) If the grade awarded is neither the minimum nor the maximum of the foreign grading scale, the formula indicated in point 1 shall be applied.

b) If the awarded grade is equal to the minimum or the maximum in the foreign grading scale:

Since the foreign system includes fewer useful grade intervals than the Italian system, a direct correspondence between the Italian and foreign minimum/maximum grades is not possible. Therefore, the following formulas must be applied:

If: D.m. = Max. m.

$$I.m. = 100 + \frac{(12 h - 6)}{(V.max. - V.min.)}$$

Se: V. d. = V. min

$$V. i. = 60 - \frac{(12 h - 6)}{(Max. m. - Min.m.)}$$

Where:

$$h = \frac{(Max.m. - Min.m.)}{48}$$

And it represents the rounding margin in the Italian system (approximately 2%).

The resulting Italian grade must be rounded to the nearest quarter unit.

Note: For the French system, the maximum grade considered for merit-based calculations is 16 points, not 20.
